Courtney Tiemeyer was born in Montgomery, Ala. on May 18, 1988. She attended East Carolina University on a ROTC scholarship where she received a Bachelor of Science in criminal justice. Upon graduation, she commissioned in the Army as a second lieutenant.

Upon completion of Basic Officer Leadership Course, Tiemeyer was assigned to Fort Sill, Okla. where she assisted in the reorganization of the 4th Battalion, 3rd Air Defense Artillery (ADA). She initially served as the Headquarters platoon leader in A Battery, 4th Battalion 3rd ADA, as well as serving as a tactical control officer. After serving as a platoon leader, she moved to the position of the battery executive officer. She deployed to Kuwait from October 2012 through October of 2013 where she continued to serve as the battery executive officer. Upon redeployment, she was reassigned to Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 4-3rd ADA to serve as the battalion adjutant.
