

Fort Sill Real I.D. Facts

- The Real I.D. Act was enacted 05 JAN 2005.
- State-issued driver licenses and identification (ID) cards from states not meeting the standards cannot be used for accessing Federal facilities beginning 10 JAN 2016, unless the issuing State's compliancy deadline has been extended by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS).
- As of 06 SEP 2016, the 4 States/Territories not compliant are:
 - America Samoa, Minnesota, Missouri, Washington
 - Federal Officials may continue to accept Enhanced Driver Licenses from these states.

- The compliancy deadline for States/Territories is 10 OCT 2016; Army installations is 10 JAN 2017* (90 day extension granted 23 SEP 16).
- The following forms of alternate I.D. are accepted in lieu of a non-compliant State's driver license:
 - United States passport or United States Passport Card
 - Permanent Resident Card/Alien Registration Receipt Card (Form I-551)
 - Foreign passport with a temporary (I-551) stamp or temporary (I-551) printed notation on a machine readable immigrant visa
 - Employment authorization document that contains a photograph (Form I-766)
 - In the case of a nonimmigrant alien authorized to work for a specific employer incident to status, a foreign passport with Form I-94 or Form I-94A bearing the same name as the passport and containing an endorsement of the alien's nonimmigrant status, as long as the endorsement has not yet expired and the proposed employment is not in conflict with any restrictions or limitations identified on the form.
 - Current/valid driver licenses from a Real ID Act –compliant State or State with a REAL ID Act extension for implementation

- Driver License or ID card issued by Federal or Local Government Agencies meeting REAL ID standards with photo, name, DOB, gender, height, eye color, and address
 - School identification card with a photograph
 - U.S. Military or draft record
 - U.S. Coast Guard Merchant Mariner Cards, Transportation Worker I.D. Card
 - Native American Tribal Document

- All persons requesting unescorted access will continue to be vetted through the National Crime Information Center, prior to being issued a locally produced ID or pass. If a visitor requesting access does not have REAL ID Act compliant form of identification and cannot provide supplemental identity proofing documents, they must be escorted at all times while on the installation.
