## MISSION OF THE FIELD ARTILLERY



## LEADERSHIP

Sufficient leadership opportunities exist within CMF 13 for the ranks of Sergeant through Staff Sergeant. However, within 2 of 8 MOSs at the Staff Sergeant level we have a shortage of MTOE leadership positions. Therefore, there may be soldiers who have not had the opportunity to serve in a MTOE Leadership Position at their current grade of Staff Sergeant.

Soldiers who are filling HQDA-directed TDA or non-MTOE positions are filling an Army requirement and should be considered competitive. However, soldiers who have held back to back TDA or non-MTOE positions are the exception and not the norm for CMF 13.

No single assignment, regardless of the nature, should be viewed in isolation as compared to the trend of performance and conduct over many years. The above high risk opportunity assignments by themselves do not make a Sergeant First Class. Success in the assignments taken with successes throughout a career provide a reliable yardstick for promotability. Selection to perform SFC or other MSG duties while a SSG is an indicator of leader potential.
