“Chipyong-ni, this small northwestern village was the location of one of the most significant battles of the Korean War. Here elements of the 2nd Infantry Division, the French battalion, the First Ranger Co., three artillery units, and a tank unit found themselves facing the left flank of the advance of the Communist Chinese Forces (CCF). The battle ranged from 13-15 Feb., 1951. Surrounded by elements of six CCF divisions the United Nations forces managed to hold and on 15 Feb., were relieved when the Fifth Cavalry Regiment supported with tanks broke through and the siege was ended. Despite heavy casualties – 259 wounded, 52 killed, and 42 missing – the action halted the CCF drive into South Korea.”
