



## ABOUT RISK REDUCTION

The Risk Reduction Program is a Commander's Program designed to identify high risk soldier behavior and to assess soldier readiness at battalion/brigade level. Incident numbers are reported to the Risk Reduction Office on a monthly basis for the following: accidents, alcohol offenses, chapter eliminations, child abuse, courts martial, drug offenses, financial problems, positive UAs, STI's, spouse abuse, self harm/suicide attempts, deaths, AWOL, traffic violations, crimes against persons, crimes against property, number of UA samples shipped, housing warning letters, eviction notices, and disciplinary actions. This information is then broken down by Battalion/Brigade and presented to Commanders on a quarterly basis, making it easy to identify problem areas within their unit. Prevention options are then reviewed, presented, and discussed with Command.

Unit Risk Inventory Surveys (URIs) developed by the Department of the Army are administered to active duty soldiers by the Risk Reduction Program. The URI is an **anonymous** questionnaire designed to screen for high-risk behaviors and practices that compromise unit readiness. The results are analyzed by battalion/brigade, NOT on an individual basis. The survey takes LESS than 30 minutes to complete. Once the surveys have been administered to a unit, they are sent to ACSAP for processing. The results are usually received by the Risk Reduction Office within one to two weeks after administration. Upon receipt, a briefing with the Unit Commander will be scheduled to review the results. At this meeting the unit's "high risk" areas of concern will be discussed and a plan for prevention/intervention efforts will be developed.

As well as conducting URIs, the Risk Reduction Program also conducts R-URIs (Re-Integration Unit Risk Inventory Surveys) given to soldiers returning from deployment 90-120 days after their return. R-URI results provide valuable information to Commanders about significant or critical responses that may compromise unit readiness among redeployed soldiers.

**Data Collection is maintained by designated staff agencies, in strict accordance with the following specifications, and provided to the RRP Coordinator monthly;**

- By battalion/equivalent and, when applicable, by separate companies/equivalent;
- By total number of persons (not by name) -- as opposed to reporting "incidents," some of which might involve several persons, and
- Units/Soldiers assigned to shot groups.

## DEFINITIONS AND REPORTING CONTACTS

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### **Provost Marshal (PMO/DES)**

Hewart Moon (580) 558-6004

- **AWOLs:** The total number of AWOL titled/charged against members of battalion/equivalent or separate companies/equivalent.

- **Drug Offenses:** The number of drug offenses titled/charged to members of reporting unit. These include, but are not limited to, possession, sale, and distribution (but NOT USE) of a controlled substance. (DO NOT INCLUDE UA POSITIVES).

- **Alcohol Offenses:** The number of alcohol-related offenses titled/charged to members of reporting unit. These include, but are not limited to, DWI/DUI, public intoxication, drunk and disorderly, alcohol-related reckless driving, possession by a minor, and consumption by a minor.

- **Traffic Violations:** The number of moving traffic violations titled/charged to members of reporting unit. These include, but are not limited to, speeding, failure to obey a traffic device, accidents, and non-alcohol related reckless driving.

- **Crimes against Persons:** The number of new crimes where the perpetrator and/or victim, is a member of reporting unit. These include, but are not limited to, simple assault, aggravated assault, robbery, concealed weapons, kidnapping, harassment and threats, sodomy, rape, indecent assault, adultery, and forgery. (DO NOT include any of the Drug Offenses, Positive UAs, Alcohol Offenses, Domestic Violence, Spouse Abuse, Child Abuse or Neglect, Family Violence, Failure to Obey a Lawful Order, False Statements, Reports, or Swearing, and any unsubstantiated charges in this risk factor).

- **Crimes against Property:** The number of new crimes against property where the perpetrator and/or victim, is a member of reporting unit. These include, but are not limited to, house breaking, arson, burglary, automobile theft, theft of government property, theft of private property, damage to property, and vandalism.

### **DHR Casualty Office**

- **Deaths:** The total number of all deaths compiled by battalion/equivalent or separate companies/equivalent. These include suicides, natural causes, homicide, POV related deaths, non-combat related deaths.

### **Safety Office**

- **Accidents:** The number of accidents among members of reporting unit, on or off-duty, which result in a total cost of property damage of \$2,000 or more, but less than \$500,000; and/or a nonfatal injury, occupational illness, or disability that causes 1 or more days away from work or training beyond the day or shift on which it occurred. (Class C & D accidents)

### **Preventive Medicine:**

- **Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs):** Total number of new cases of STIs among members of reporting unit, whether they remain deployable or non-deployable. These include all forms of STIs, including, but not limited to, gonorrhea, Chlamydia, and syphilis. HIV is a specific disease of military concern, separate from STIs and not reported under STIs (Note: Hepatitis is not reported under STI)

### **Suicide Prevention:**

- **Suicide Attempts/Self Harm:** The total number of suicide attempts and self harm (NOT ideations) by members of reporting unit.

### **ASAP Installation Biochemical Testing (IBTC):**

- **UA Samples:** The total number of urinalysis samples from battalion/equivalent or separate companies/equivalent that were shipped for testing.

- **Positive UAs:** The number of confirmed positive urinalysis test results among members of reporting unit.

### **Housing Office:**

- **Warning Letters:** Total number of letters to members of battalion/equivalent or separate companies/equivalent warning that, if inappropriate behavior continues, the consequence will be loss of on-post housing.

- **Eviction Notices:** Total number of notices indicating that members of battalion /equivalent or separate companies/equivalent have been evicted from on-post housing.

### **Staff Judge Advocate:**

- **Chapter Eliminations:** Total number of chapter eliminations in battalion/equivalent or separate companies/equivalent that are based on Chapters 5, 9, 10, 13, or 14.

- **Courts Martial:** Total number of courts martial in battalion/equivalent or separate companies/equivalent.

- **Disciplinary Actions:** Total number of administrative disciplinary actions (non-judicial) in battalion/equivalent or separate companies/equivalent.

### **Financial Readiness/AER:**

- **Financial Problems:** New cases of Soldiers or Family members from reporting unit, either voluntarily or Command-directed for financial problems associated with writing bad checks, excessive debt, or inability to meet current financial obligations. Includes Soldiers or Family members who seek emergency food vouchers or assistance from Army Emergency Relief (except those who seek Army Emergency Relief assistance for travel due to serious illness or death in the Family), emergency car repair, eviction, mismanagement and pay problems.

### **Family Advocacy social Work Services (FAP):**

- **Spouse/Domestic Abuse:** The number of substantiated and/or met criteria cases or spouse/domestic abuse where the perpetrator and/or victim is/are member of reporting unit. Domestic violence or a pattern of behavior resulting in emotional/psychological abuse, economic control, and/or interference with personal liberty that is directed toward a person of the opposite sex who is current or former spouse, a person with whom the abuser shares a child in common, or a current or former intimate partner with whom the abuser shares or has shared a common domicile.

- **Child Abuse:** The number of substantiated and/or met criteria cases where the perpetrator acting as parent, guardian, foster parent, or a caregiver is a member of reporting unit. These include a non-accidental injury to a child that, regardless of motive, is inflicted or allowed to be inflicted by the person responsible for the child's care. This includes physical or sexual abuse, emotional abuse, or neglect of the child.
