## Yellow Border Safety Alert Motorcycle Accident (Non Fatal)

### Synopsis

While still under investigation, preliminary findings indicate the following: On 13 April 2016 approximately 20:00, a 29 year old CPT riding a Triumph Daytona 675 Motorcycle traveling west bound on Gore BLVD collided with a pickup believed to have run a stop sign traveling North on 1<sup>st</sup> Street. Rider was taken to Comanche Hospital under went surgery to remove spleen. Injuries sustained to rider report to be non life-threatening and is expected to make a full recovery.



**This is the third recorded motorcycle accident in FY-16**

### Factors

- Rider is experienced and has completed full progression of training
- Reports indicate that rider was wearing all required PPE
- Rider active in unit mentorship program


### Recommended Soldier/Leader Actions

- Unit/Organization leadership discuss this incident with all personnel. Disseminate and post on all unit/organization safety boards
- Motorcycle riders should always anticipate others actions on the road and look for a way-out
- Commanders enforce Fort Sill Motorcycle Program that includes mentorship, training and personal protective equipment requirements. Track and ensure required progressive training of riders and attendance of training within prescribed time requirements
- Leaders and mentors, discuss the benefits of wearing additional PPE beyond the minimum
- Leaders and mentors, review and discuss with unit riders on Preliminary Loss Reports for motorcycle accidents <https://safety.army.mil/STATISTICS/PreliminaryLossReports.aspx>
