

CW4 (Retired) SCOTT P. STEVENS

UNITED STATES ARMY

CW4 (Ret) Scott P. Stevens entered the Army on 1 February 1974 as a Private (E-1) at Fort Jackson, South Carolina. He attended AIT at Fort Bliss, Texas in April 1974.

His first duty assignment was as a HAWK Launcher Crewmen with 6-52 ADA at Fort Bliss, Texas where he attained the rank of SP4. While there he participated in one Annual Service Practice for his unit and supported a Japanese ASP. He was then transferred to 5-57 ADA, Fort Bliss, Texas as a member of the first Improved HAWK Training Detachment with subsequent assignment to field Improved HAWK to1-2 ADA in Korea from August 1975 to August 1976. He reenlisted for the 24G, HAWK ICWAR/IFF Mechanic's course, was promoted to the rank of Sergeant (E-5), and was attached to 5-57 ADA, Fort Bliss, Texas in May of 1977 for checkout and acceptance of equipment and later assignment for the newly organized HAWK Tri-AD Battalion 2-72 ADA at Fort Riley, Kansas until December 1979. From January 1980 until January 1983 he was assigned to 2-62 ADA in Bitburg, Germany where he was promoted to Staff Sergeant (E-6) and held the position of 24G Section Chief. He was also the TMDE Coordinator, Unit Publications NCO, and Equal Opportunity NCO. While there he participated in five Annual Service Practices (three for his unit and two for other units), and was selected by the battalion commander to act as the 24L DS IFF Mechanic during an MOS shortage. From February 1983 until October 1985 he was assigned to Staff and Faculty Battalion, Fort Bliss, Texas as a 24G Instructor, he was also the Publications NCO and was the examinations custodian. From November 1985 to 1988 he was assigned to 6-62 ADA, Giebelstadt, Germany as a 24G Section Chief and then Platoon Sergeant when promoted to Sergeant First Class (E-7). While there he participated in three ASPs, and was the first recipient of the "Golden Eagle" certificate for TMDE. He was also the acting First Sergeant for eight months.

CW4 (Ret) Stevens was assigned to 2-7 ADA at Fort Bliss, Texas in February 1990 until 1994 as a WO1, 140E Patriot System Maintenance Technician. While there he deployed twice to SWA and deployed Patriot to Korea. While in Korea he was instrumental in designing and contracting to have built the Missile Storage Area (MSA) at Osan USAFB. From 1994 to 1995 he was assigned as a WO2, to the Patriot Officer Instruction Division, 6th ADA Brigade as a Patriot Warrant Officer Instructor. While there he reviewed and updated the written examination data base (1600 questions), updated the Publications Initial Distribution accounts for instructors and students. In 1996 he was assigned to 1-43 ADA, Korea as the Battalion EMMO, as a WO2. While there he developed a program of instruction to mentor all 1st /2nd Lieutenants in the battalion on maintenance actions and procedures. He also instituted and chaired a Warrant Officer Professional Development Program. From 1996 to 2000 he was assigned to the Directorate of Tactics, Training and Doctrine (DOTTD), Doctrine Division. He was a Subject Matter Expert (SME) for the Patriot,

THAAD, MEADS, and EAADS systems. Assigned to develop and write Patriot and THAAD doctrine. He led a team of four writer/developers for Patriot (FM 44-100, FM 44-85, FM 44-85-1), THAAD draft doctrinal preliminary documents and attended and chaired numerous IPTs for MEADS and EAADS. Additionally, he represented the CG of USAADASCH and Fort Bliss for four Branch Specific Training (BST) briefings at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas for the CGSC course. He participated in two, Functional Area Assessments (FAA) for the Air Defense Proponent and developed the Air Defense Acronym and Abbreviations Dictionary which was posted to the ADA Homepage. From 2000 to Feb 2003 he was assigned to 69th ADA Brigade as the S3 EMMO. While there he was the Brigades Force Modernization Developments Action Officer, and Senior Tactics Officer. He participated in Juniper Cobra in support of Israel. From March 2003 to April 2004 he was assigned to the Directorate of Training and Doctrine (DOTD), Doctrine Division. He was the SME for Patriot and SLAMRAAM, and reviewed comments from staffed field units on the Patriot ADA Brigade Gunnery Program. He led a team of eight doctrine writer/developers to produce a White Paper detailing original doctrine for the developing SALMRAAM system, and participated in the development of the USAADASCH Patriot Top Gun Program. As of 1 April 2004 he retired with 30 years active federal service.

He is a graduate of the 16D HAWK Launcher Crewmen Course, 24G ICWAR/IFF Maintenance Mechanics Course, and Instructor Training Course, Fort Bliss, Texas; the NBC NCO Course, Fort Riley, Kansas; PLDC at Landstuhl, Germany; WOEC Fort Rucker, Alabama; WOBC and WOAC at Fort Bliss, Texas; TRADOC Manager Development, Fort Monroe, Virginia; and holds an Associate's Degree in Science from Excelsior College.

His awards include Legion of Merit; Meritorious Service Medal (2nd award); ARCOM (7th award); Army Achievement Medal (5th award); Valorous Unit Award; Army Good Conduct Medal (5th award); National Defense Service Medal (3rd award); Southwest Asia Service Medal (with 3 Bronze Service Stars); Non-Commissioned Officers Professional Development Ribbon w/numeral 2; Army Service Ribbon; Army Overseas Service Ribbon 2/numeral 5; SUKULIBM; and KUKULIBM.
