SUBJECT: Fiscal Year (FY) 19 Centralized Selection List (CSL) Command and Key
Billet Slating Guidance for Field Artillery Lieutenant Colonels.

1. The mission of the Field Artillery is to destroy, defeat, or disrupt the enemy with integrated fires to enable maneuver commanders to dominate in unified land operations. To accomplish this mission we must match the right leader to the right unit.
2. In order to ensure the best integration and synchronization of fires, we must align the knowledge, skills and abilities of our tactical and technical experts with the appropriate type of unit, while continuing to broaden and develop our younger leaders in the profession of arms.
3. In addition to guidance already established by the Army Chief of Staff, the following guidance is provided when considering the slating of Field Artillery Lieutenant Colonels:
 - a. Slate the best officer for the unit based on experiences, and identified skills, traits and attributes.
 - b. Slate officers with strong tactical fire support backgrounds to Field Artillery Battalions in Brigade Combat Teams.
 - c. Consider previous unit and geographical experiences as strengths when deciding between like officers. An officer's experience enables the capacity for successful integration and synchronization of fires. Lastly, officers must be fit and fully qualified to deploy their respective commands.
