JAN/FEB: Red Book.

Deadline for submissions is Dec. 1.

The Red Book is a review of what Fires units have accomplished in the last year.

MARCH/APRIL: Fires strong. How is the field artillery and air defense artillery staying fit for undetermined warfare?
