

Over the last nine years, a new era of combat emerged, where counterinsurgency and asymmetric warfare are the norm. This shift continues to place a great amount of strain on our most important resources, our Service Members and Families. The Army recognizes that the total number and rate of suicides continue to rise and this is of deep concern at all leadership levels.

Suicide has a multitude of causes, and no simple solution. There are many potential areas for intervention, and it is difficult to pinpoint the best approach because each suicide is unique.

Here at Fort Sill we believe in fostering a holistic approach to treatment, leveraging primary care for early recognition and intervention, and when needed, providing innovative specialty care. The areas of focus to reduce risk include: conducting data collection and detect contributing risk factors; facilitating partnerships across the installation, and civilian organizations to increase collaboration and communication; reducing stigma and increasing access to resources to provide needed care; and using research to close gaps and identify best practices.
