SUBJECT: Diner Use Policy for Appropriated Funds (APF) Dining Facilities (DFACs) on Fort Sill

1. References:

- a. Army Regulation (AR) 30-22 (Army Food Program), 17 July 2019.
- b. Department of the Army (DA) Pamphlet 30-22 (Operating procedures for the Army Food Program), 17 July 2019.
- c. Department of Defense (DoD) Food Service Program (DFSP) 1338.10 (Department of Defense Manual), 2 December 2014.
- d. Institutional Training Directed Lodging and Meal (ITDLM) Policy Handbook (excerpt), 1 April 2016.

2. The core mission of APF DFACs is to feed Subsistence-in-Kind (SIK) Soldiers that are not receiving Basic Allowance for Subsistence (BAS). These Soldiers are entitled to subsist without charge.

3. As the Fort Sill DFACs are operating at a utilization rate of less than 100%, in accordance with AR 30-22 the undersigned has determined that it is in the best interest of Fort Sill to enhance morale and community relations by allowing additional categories of diners to purchase meals in an APF DFAC.

4. Therefore, effective 1 August 2020 and until superseded, patronage of the Fort Sill appropriated fund DFACs will be authorized for the following personnel:

- a. All SIK Soldiers.
- b. Army Active Duty (AD), Army National Guard (ARNG) and United States Army Reserve (USAR) Soldiers attending selected courses of instruction at Army institutions in a temporary duty (TDY), annual training (AT), or active duty status for training.
- c. Soldiers attending institutional training funded by the Deputy Chief of Staff, G

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3/5/7, Director, ARNG and Chief, USAR, ITDLM.

d. Officers and enlisted personnel retaining BAS while on duty, to include officers and enlisted Soldier's immediate family members while on Permanent Change of Station (PCS) orders or if the Soldier is missing in action or a prisoner of war.

e. Officers and enlisted Soldiers not assigned/attached to a unit on the installation while on TDY status. Military Training Service Support Program (MTSS/ITDLM) – Must carry orders and have correct Meal Entitlement Code (MEC) update on Common Access Card (CAC).

f. Members of other Military services and Foreign Military stationed on Fort Sill.

g. Food handlers on duty in an APF DFAC.

h. 3443-Guns-n-Rockets DFAC is the designated facility for DoD Civilians, Civilian dignitaries, and retired Military personnel.

5. The following personnel conducting short-term training are authorized to subsist in Fort Sill DFACs if a determination of supportability is made through the Logistics Readiness Center (LRC) during the pre-coordination process. Units of external commands conducting training on Fort Sill will coordinate support through the Directorate of Plans, Training, Mobilization and Security (DPTMS).

a. Members of Army senior and junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps.

b. Cadets of U.S. military academies on TDY.

c. AT reserve component enlisted Soldiers.

d. Members of youth groups sponsored at either the local or national level.

e. Military candidates undergoing examinations at an Army garrison or prospective enlistees accompanied by a recruiter.

6. The following other personnel are authorized to subsist in APF DFACs on a case-by-case basis:

a. Distinguished guests/groups escorted by Military members.

b. Military guests at holiday meals (Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Army Birthday).



c. Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) entertainment groups.

d. LRC-Contracted Civilian drivers operating mass-transit vehicles in garrison for the purpose of transporting Soldiers to and from dining facilities.

FOOD SERVICE CHARGES AT APPROPRIATED FUND DINING  
FACILITIES AND THE MILITARY ACADEMIES  
EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2021

Volume 12, *Special Accounts, Funds and Programs*, of DoD Financial Management Regulation (DoD 7000.14-R) stipulates that the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense (Comptroller) shall prescribe the rates for food service charges annually.

1. Chapter 19 (*Food Service Program*) of Volume 12, addresses rates to be charged for meals at Department of Defense (DoD) dining facilities. The following food service rates are effective January 1, 2021.

A. Traditional Meal System

Dinner	\$3.85	\$5.10

Night Snack	\$2.75	\$3.65

The **discount rate** shall be charged to:

- (a) spouses and other dependents of enlisted personnel in pay grades E-1 through E-4.
- (b) members of organized nonprofit youth groups sponsored at either the national or local level and permitted to eat in the general dining facility by the Commanding Officer of the installation. Such groups include: Civil Air Patrol, Junior ROTC and Scouting units.
- (c) officers, enlisted members, and federal civilian employees who are not receiving the meal portion of per diem and who are either:
  - (1) Performing duty on a U.S. Government vessel,
  - (2) On field duty,
  - (3) In a group travel status,
  - (4) Included in essential unit messing (EUM) as defined in the JTR, Chapter 2, Par. 020315, or
  - (5) Assigned to Essential Station Messing (ESM) as an enlisted member as defined in DoDD 1418.05.
- (d) officers, enlisted members, and federal employees who are not receiving the meal portion of per diem, and who are on a U.S. Government aircraft on official duty either as a passenger or as a crew member engaged in flight operations.

- (e) officers, enlisted members, and federal employees on Joint Task Force operations other than training at temporary U.S. installations, or using temporary dining facilities.

The **standard rate** shall be charged to all officers and enlisted members receiving an allowance for subsistence (other than those addressed under discount rate (a) through (e) above); any officer, enlisted member or federal civilian employee receiving the subsistence portion of per diem; and all other personnel (including Reserve Component officers on Inactive Duty Training) authorized to eat in DoD dining facilities.

- B. A la Carte Meal Pricing System. When using an “a la carte” menu, the price of each item on the menu shall be established at 133 percent of the food cost (i.e., the cost of unprepared food multiplied by a factor of 1.33).

2. Chapter 20 (*Military Academy Dining Hall Operations*) of Volume 12 stipulates that the daily amount of subsistence shall be prescribed by the Secretary of Defense for each Military Department that operates a Service Academy dining hall in support of cadets or midshipmen. The following rates are effective January 1, 2021.

- A. Daily Cadet/Midshipmen Subsistence Allowance. The subsistence allowance is applicable when in a leave or temporary duty status, and is equal to the daily rate for an enlisted member receiving Basic Allowance for Subsistence (BAS). The daily rate is \$12.90.

- B. Academy Dining Hall Food Service. The rates below are to provide food service support to cadets or midshipmen, and the amount so prescribed will be allocated by the Military Departments from the current Military Personnel Appropriation to a non-appropriated fund at each Academy based on the number of cadets and midshipmen present for training.
